AUCTION BASKET DONATIONS NEEDED

Our auction baskets are some of our favorite and best sellers at the auction. Every year we ask each CAB family to send in a few items for the baskets. Please send items in no later than November 1st. Items can be dropped off at your child's classroom or in Mrs. Cleary Matelski's office.

This year we are putting together color themed baskets:

K-1= red basket
2-3= orange basket
4-5= yellow basket
6-8= green basket
9-12= blue basket
Staff/Board= purple basket

Item ideas for your child's color basket are written on school houses and are hanging in the main hallway.

How it works:

1. Find your child's grade color.
2. Choose a school house and purchase the item written on that school house.
3. Return BOTH the school house and the purchased item to their teacher by November 1st.

In addition to our color themed baskets we will also be doing something special with candy bars. This year we are asking for regular size candy bars ONLY. Please send these in to your child's teacher by November 1st.

EMERGENCY CARDS

Heaven forbid we should ever need these cards in an emergency situation, but they do provide contact information and a snapshot of your child's health and concerns for the staff, administration and emergency personnel to ensure proper care.

These cards were sent home with students this week. Please take the time to fill out the cards as thoroughly and accurately as possible. If your child has allergies or takes medications that may hamper emergency procedures, please carefully and legibly list those on the card. These may well save your child's life in an emergency situation.

MEDICATIONS



Any student who requires prescription medication to be administered at school **MUST** fill out a

Permission for Prescribed Medication form (available in the office) and have it signed by your child's physician in order for disbursement by staff. If your child needs over the counter medication, we will call you to obtain your permission before administration unless we have a signed Non-Prescription Medication Permission Slip on file (sent home with students).

LICE FREE/NIT FREE SCHOOL

It's that time of year again - time to start checking for signs of those annoyingly persistent critters - LICE. Concord Academy Boyne has a Lice Free/Nit Free policy, which means that if any lice or lice eggs (nits) are found in a student's hair, their parents will be called to pick up their child to treat and de-nit them. Students returning to school must report to the office to be re-checked before entering the classroom. Because infestations can occur at any time, we ask that you routinely check your child/children's heads for signs of lice. Thank you in advance for your cooperation in helping us maintain a lice-free learning environment.



Tardy/Check-In

If your child arrives to school after 8:15 a.m., they **MUST** sign-in with Mrs. Kohler in the front office and obtain an "Admit" pass.

SCHOOL STORE

Mrs. Wittenmyer will again be operating the School Store where food (lunch & snack) and items, such as notebooks, folders, pencils, and erasers will be available for

students to purchase. Hours of operation for the School Store are 8:00-8:15, between 2nd and 3rd periods, and all lunch periods.

After School!



Once again after school care is available for students in grades K-5. After School will run from 3:20-5:00 daily in the Middle Room (Rm 6/7) and will begin Monday, September 10th. After School does not run the first and last week of school, on any half days, and on the last day of school before Thanksgiving, Christmas, and Spring breaks. The cost is \$5 per day per student. Students should also bring their own snack.

NO AFTER CARE:

Tuesday, November 20th (Thanksgiving Break)
Friday, December 21st (Christmas Break)
Friday, February 15th (Half Day)
Thursday, March 21st (Spring Break)
Friday, April 19th (Half Day)
Friday, May 24th (Half Day)
June 3rd-7th (Last Week of School)

Parents need to sign up in advance for the days they plan to use the program and prepay or pay daily at pick up. Failure to pay daily will result in loss of privileges to use the program. If a drop-in situation does arise, call the office (231-582-0194) to let us know your child will be attending.

Please fill out the attached form if you plan to use the program and return it to the office.

It is very important to pick up your child up no later than 5:00 pm. After 5:00, a late fee will incur of \$1 for each minute late per child. If you are late for pick up on more than one occasion, you will be suspended from After Care and be asked to make other arrangements for your child. All of the staff at After School thank you in advance for prompt pick up.
